

CR 712. Knowing (REVISED2)

A person acts “knowingly,” or “with knowledge” when the person:

- *is aware* that he/she is doing a specific act, or *is aware* of a particular fact or circumstance surrounding his/her conduct,

AND

- *is aware* that the action taken is reasonably certain to cause a particular result.

Note to Committee:

This revision to the instruction also attempts to respond to Ken’s concerns (as expressed at the last committee meeting) by combining what were previously two separate bullets (awareness of act and awareness of fact/circumstance surrounding conduct).
