RE: 2022 Poverty Income Guidelines

The Indigent Defense Act is codified at Title 78B, Chapter 22 of the Utah Code. Utah Code Section [78B-22-202](#) states that an individual is considered indigent for the purpose of appointing counsel if the individual “has an income level at or below 150% of the United States poverty level as defined by the most recently revised poverty income guidelines published by the United States Department of Health and Human Services.” The following table has been generated from the HHS poverty guidelines published in the Federal Register on January 21, 2022.
