

1 **Rule 14-413. MCLE credit for qualified audio and video presentations; webcasts; computer**
2 **interactive telephonic programs; writing; lecturing; teaching; live attendance.**

3 (a) Credit will be allowed for self-study with Board accredited audio and video presentations, webcasts or
4 computer interactive telephonic programs in accordance with the following.

5 (a)(1) One hour of self-study credit will be allowed for viewing and/or listening to 60 minutes of audio or
6 video presentations, webcasts or computer interactive telephonic programs in accordance with Rule 14-
7 408(a).

8 (a)(2) No more than 12 hours of credit may be obtained through self-study with audio or video
9 presentations, webcasts or computer interactive telephonic programs. Upon application to the Board, the
10 Board may grant a waiver, permitting a lawyer on active status to obtain all required hours of credit
11 through self-study, if the lawyer:

12 (a)(2)(A) does not reside in Utah; and

13 (a)(2)(B) is engaged in full-time volunteer work for a religious or charitable organization.

14 (b) Credit will be allowed for writing and publishing an article in a legal periodical in accordance with the
15 following.

16 (b)(1) To be eligible for any credit, an article must:

17 (b)(1)(A) be written to address a lawyer audience;

18 (b)(1)(B) be at least 3,000 words in length;

19 (b)(1)(C) be published by a recognized publisher of legal material; and

20 (b)(1)(D) not be used in conjunction with a seminar.

21 (b)(2) Three credit hours will be allowed for each 3,000 words in the article. An application for
22 accreditation of the article must be submitted at least 60 days prior to reporting the activity for credit. Two
23 or more authors may share credit obtained pursuant to this paragraph in proportion to their contribution to
24 the article. No more than 12 hours of credit may be obtained through writing and publishing an article or
25 articles.

26 (c) Credit will be allowed for lecturing in an accredited CLE program, ~~and~~ part-time teaching by a lawyer in
27 an approved law school, or delivering a paper or speech on a professional subject at a meeting primarily
28 attended by lawyers, legal assistants or law students in accordance with the following.

29 (c)(1) Lecturers in an accredited CLE program and part-time teachers may receive three hours of credit
30 for each hour spent in lecturing or teaching as provided in Rule 14-408(a).

31 (c)(2) No lecturing or teaching credit is available for participation in a panel discussion.

32 (c)(3) No more than 12 hours of credit may be obtained through lecturing and part-time teaching.

33 (d) Credit will be allowed for lecturing and teaching by full-time law school faculty members in accordance
34 with the following.

35 (d)(1) Full-time law school faculty members may receive credit for lecturing and teaching but only for
36 lecturing and teaching accredited CLE courses.

37 (d)(2) No lecturing or teaching credit is available for participation in panel discussions.

38 (d)(3) No more than 12 hours of credit may be obtained through lecturing and teaching by full-time law
39 school faculty members.

40 (e) Credit will be allowed for attendance at an accredited CLE program in accordance with the following.

- 41 (e)(1) Credit is allowed for attendance at an accredited CLE program in accordance with Rule 14-408(a).
- 42 (e)(2) ~~There is no~~ A minimum of 12 CLE hours, with no maximum restriction, ~~on the percentage of the~~
43 ~~credit hour requirement which may~~ must be obtained through attendance at an accredited CLE program.
44 ~~However, a minimum of 12 hours must be obtained through attendance at live~~ in-person CLE programs.
- 45 (f) The total of all hours allowable under paragraphs (a), (b), (c), and (d) of this rule may not exceed 12
46 hours during a reporting period.
- 47 (g) No credit is allowed for self-study programs except as expressly permitted under paragraph (a).
