

Divorce Education for Children in Logan

Why?

Children, as well as adults need information about the divorce process. The class helps identify feelings common to children in divorce situations, while teaching communication skills to empower children to express their feelings. The class covers the divorce process and explains that it is not the children's fault.

What?

A 90-minute class is taught by experienced mental health professionals who address the most common issues of children whose parents are divorcing and discuss various coping alternatives.

When?

The class is held the last Thursday of the month from 3:30 to 5 p.m. Plan to arrive 10 minutes prior to the start of class. For a current class schedule, go to www.utcourts.gov/specproj/dived-child.html or call (435) 750-1300.

Where?

Cache County Courthouse, 135 North 100 West, Logan.

Cost?

There is no cost to attend. The classes are free of charge.

Here are some of the responses from children who have attended the class and parents whose children have attended the class:

"I learned that my parents decide why they want a divorce and I don't need to get caught up in it."

"I learned the divorce is not my fault."

"My child is more confident in talking about her anger and more able to express her hurt."



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Divorce Education for Children

When adults go through a divorce, there are programs available to assist them in making the transition, including a mandatory class offered through the Utah State Courts. But what about the children of divorcing parents? A gap exists between programs that are available for adults and classes available for children of divorcing parents. To fill this need, the Utah State Courts has developed a new program called Divorce Education for Children.

Children's Class

A Divorce Education for Children class is available for children 5- to 12-years old (kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th grades) whose parents are divorced or divorcing. The class is presented once each month at the Cache County Courthouse, 135 North 100 West, Logan.

The program's curriculum provides children with skills they can use, such as how to express their feelings to parents. Mental health professionals teach the class with the assistance from state court judges and commissioners. The class is not intended as psychotherapy and participation in the children's class is voluntary.

The class is offered free of charge.

"Children often feel responsible for their parents' divorce," said 3rd District Court Commissioner Michael Evans.

"The course is designed to minimize the adverse effects divorce has on children by teaching them coping skills."

In 2008, 13,728 divorce cases were filed in Utah; 10,841 children were involved in those cases.

Divorce Education for Children--a subcommittee of the Standing Committee on Judicial Outreach--has developed this program.
