In accordance with UCJA Rule 4-404 (5)(E), this order includes the standards by which the Seventh District Court clerical staff may dispose of requests for excusal from jury service or postponement of jury service term.

The clerical staff of the Seventh District Court may dispose of the following requests for excusal and postponement.

Prospective jurors with Alzheimer’s disease or Dementia may be excused permanently upon presentation of a doctor’s note.

Prospective jurors 80 years of age or older may be excused permanently upon request.

Prospective jurors requesting to be excused without claiming an undue hardship, public necessity or incapability of jury service found under the Utah Code will be qualified. Undue hardship does not include employment and travel for work, business owners, sole providers or primary caretakers, and those without transportation.

Prospective jurors enrolled as a post-high school student without additional justification will be qualified.

Prospective jurors moving out of the area during a jury service term will be qualified until the date of relocation.
