

COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS ASSIGNMENT GUIDELINES FOR JUVENILES AND FAMILIES

You have agreed to complete as part of the non-judicial process or have been ordered by the Court to complete community service hours and/or restitution. It is your responsibility to complete this assignment.

Parent(s)/guardian(s), it is your responsibility to assist your youth in complying with this agreement or court order by providing: support, supervision, transportation, and keeping accurate records of dates and hours the youth has worked.

Documentation of hours worked must be received by the Court in order to verify that the assignment has been completed. Verification is also needed for receiving credit for participation in any approved program. Please keep a copy for your records.

Suggestions for Community Service Hours: Schools, Churches, Parks & Recreation, Substance Abuse Programs, Charitable Agencies/Non-Profit, Elderly (over 65) or Disabled.

NO BABYSITTING, DAYCARE, OR WORK FOR FAMILY MEMBERS WILL BE ACCEPTED

Adherence to the following is important:

1. The work must not be hazardous
2. Neither the youth nor the parent(s)/guardian(s) are to receive any money or compensation for any services performed
3. Business/commercial enterprises are NOT approved for this assignment
