This matter is before the court upon a Petition for Writ of Certiorari, filed on June 13, 2018.

The Petition for Writ of Certiorari is granted as to the following issues:

1. Whether the Court of Appeals erred in concluding that there was no reasonable probability that the jury based its verdict on a finding that Petitioner had a reckless mental state with respect to the commission of aggravated murder.

2. Whether the Court of Appeals erred in concluding that there was no reasonable probability that the jury relied on a solicitation, request, commandment, or intentional aid by Petitioner that was not directed to the perpetrator's commission of aggravated murder.

3. Whether the Court of Appeals erred in concluding that there was no reasonable probability that the jury based its verdict on a finding that the perpetrator's conduct, rather than Petitioner's conduct, could result in the commission of aggravated murder.

A briefing schedule will be established hereafter. Pursuant to Rule 2 of the Rules of Appellate Procedure, the Court suspends the provision of Rule 26(a) that permits the

parties to stipulate to an extension of time to submit their briefs on the merits. The parties shall not be permitted to stipulate to an extension. The parties shall comply with the briefing schedule upon its issuance.
