This matter is before the court upon a Petition for Writ of Certiorari, filed on April 11, 2018.

The Petition for Writ of Certiorari is granted as to the following issues:

- 1. Whether the court of appeals erred in concluding that Respondent was not obligated to demonstrate that severed land was essential to a freeway project to obtain severance damages for a freeway interchange that was partially constructed on land taken by Petitioner.
- 2. Whether the court of appeals erred in determining that Petitioner had inadequately briefed arguments that Respondents severance damages were predicated in part on loss of visibility from aspects of the project outside of the freeway interchange.

A briefing schedule will be established hereafter. Pursuant to Rule 2 of the Rules of Appellate Procedure, the Court suspends the provision of Rule 26(a) that permits the parties to stipulate to an extension of time to submit their briefs on the merits. The parties shall not be permitted to stipulate to an extension. The parties shall comply with the briefing schedule upon its issuance.
