Important Court of Appeals Information June 2014

THE SIMPLICITY OF A DOCKETING STATEMENT

Docketing Statements shall be filed within 21 days of the filing of the notice of appeal. Docketing statements are used for the limited purpose of determining the court's jurisdiction over an appeal. Parties should avoid attaching transcripts, pleadings, or other portions of the record that are not relevant to reviewing the jurisdictional issue. It is important to make the jurisdictional determination in the early stages of an appeal. Thus, extensions of time to file docketing statements are disfavored and in no event, may exceed fifteen (15) days.

You may email documents to the Court of Appeals at courtofappeals@utcourts.gov. Fax filings are discouraged. If the rule requires copies, you must mail or file the copies contemporaneously.

IS YOUR E-MAIL ADDRESS CORRECT AT THE STATE BAR?

All orders and opinions are emailed. The Appellate database is updated weekly from the State Bar's web-site. Therefore, the e-mail address listed on the Utah State Bar web-site is the email address that will be used for all correspondence from the court. Please make sure your email address is current.
