**Re:** 2017 Poverty Income Guidelines

For the appointment of counsel in criminal cases, Utah Code Section 77-32-202(3)(a) defines indigency as “an income level at or below 150% of the United States poverty level as defined by the most recently revised poverty income guidelines published by the United States Department of Health and Human Services.” The following table has been generated from the HHS poverty guidelines published in the Federal Register on January 31, 2017.

2	\$ 24,360.00 /annual	\$ 11.71 /hour

5	\$ 43,170.00 /annual	\$ 20.75 /hour
6	\$ 49,440.00 /annual	\$ 23.77 /hour
7	\$ 55,710.00 /annual	\$ 26.78 /hour
8	\$ 61,980.00 /annual	\$ 29.80 /hour
For every family member over 8, add	\$ 6,270.00 /annual	\$ 3.01 /hour
