The National Council on Education for the Handicapped (NCEH) is pleased to announce the release of its report, "The State of Special Education in the United States, 1973-74." This report provides a comprehensive overview of the current status of special education across the country, highlighting both achievements and areas needing improvement. The findings are based on a series of site visits and data collected from various states and local educational agencies.

The report identifies several key areas of concern, including the availability of qualified personnel, the quality of instructional programs, and the extent of services provided to students with disabilities. It also offers recommendations for federal, state, and local action to address these issues and ensure that all students have access to a free and appropriate public education. The NCEH continues to be committed to advocating for the needs of students with disabilities and to promoting the highest quality of education for all.
