1 Rule 4. Time.

- 2 (a) In computing time under these rules: The following rules apply in computing any time period
- 3 specified in these rules, any local rule or court order, or in any statute that does not specify a
- 4 method of computing time.
- 5 (b) In computing time under these rules:
- 6 (b)(1i), Tthe day of the act, event or default from which the designated period of time begins to
- 7 run shall not be included.
- 8 (b)(2ii) Count every day, including intermediate Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays.
- 9 (b)(3iii) The last day of the period shall be included unless it is a Saturday, Sunday, or legal
- 10 holiday, in which event the period runs until the end of the next day which is not a Saturday,
- Sunday, or legal holiday. When a period of time allowed is less than 11 days, without reference
- to any additional time under subsection (d), intermediate Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays
- 13 shall be excluded from the computation.
- 14 (b)(4): Unless the court orders otherwise, if the clerk's office is inaccessible:
- 15 $\frac{(b)(4)(A)}{(b)}$ on the last day for filing under Rule 4(b), then the time for filing is extended to the
- 16 first accessible day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday.
- 17 (c)(b) The court may, with or without motion or notice, for cause shown, order the time period
- enlarged if request is made before the period has expired. The court may consider a motion to
- 19 grant an enlargement of a time period made after the period has expired, and may grant the
- 20 motion, if there is a reasonable excuse for failure to act within the period.
- 21 (c) A written motion, other than one which may be heard ex parte, and notice of the hearing shall
- 22 be served not later than five days before the time specified for the hearing, unless a different
- 23 period is fixed by these rules or by court order. An order fixing the period of time may for cause
- 24 shown be made on an exparte application. When the motion is supported by an affidavit, the
- 25 affidavit shall be served with the motion, and opposing affidavits may be served not later than
- one day before the hearing unless otherwise ordered by the court.
- 27 (d) Unless a different time is set by a statute or court order, filing on the last day means:
- 28 (d)(1) For electronic filing, before midnight; and
- 29 (d)(2) For filing by other means, before the clerk's office is scheduled to close.
- 30 (e)(d) Whenever a party has the right or is required to do some act or take some proceedings
- 31 within a prescribed time period after the service of a notice or other paper upon the party and the
- notice or paper is served by mail, three days shall be added to the prescribed period as calculated
- under subsection (b) (a). Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays shall be included in the

- computation of any three-day period under this subsection, except that if the last day of the three-day period is a Saturday, Sunday, or a legal holiday, the period shall run until the end of the next day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, or a legal holiday.
