

Examples of Questions for the Guardian

- The status reports indicate the ward's health care provider, treatments, and medications but I may need you to clarify some of what you have written (I did not understand some abbreviations).
- The original 2009 petition for this case indicate that stepsons (**names of interested parties**) were listed as interested parties; however, status reports and financial accountings have not been sent to them. Can you provide insight into why that did not occur?
- Status report comments on the ward's activities and functioning have been somewhat similar in the last two status reports and may need some clarification. Some questions I will have for you include:
 - Do you believe (**protected person's name**) is reaching his full potential in his current circumstances?
 - How do you encourage his independence?
 - What activities, if any, have helped (**protected person's name**) to stay engaged and not be isolated?
 - What situations does (**protected person's name**) find to be stressful?
 - How have you been able to help him through stressful times?
- The last status report dated November 2, 2015 indicates that there is a current plan for the Ward's care, training or treatment (item 24 of report) and that the plan is on file with the court. I could not find a document on such a plan in court records. Could you please provide additional comments on the plan?
- Do you foresee any problems continuing as guardian for (**protected person's name**)?
- Status reports indicated that (**protected person's name**) mental and physical health have remained about the same for the last two years; that he is doing well for his age; that while he needs medication for chronic pain, he takes relatively few medications and requires no treatment or therapy at the present time; and that while his short term memory is becoming more impaired he is not depressed and is able to largely care for himself with some reminders. Is this a correct reading and summary of recent status reports?
